# Marketing Your Books

#### Best Time to Send an Email Broadcast

I get this question a ton. It seems it comes in various formats, but all boils down to what is the best time to send an email broadcast?

An email broadcast can be a sales pitch or regular newsletter or anything you are sending out to your list.

There are several studies out there, and the actual best answer is to figure it per email address you are sending it to...because it is different for each person on your list. But that is very expensive and difficult to pull off for a lot of software companies that provide email marketing services.

So the next best thing to do is to use a service that takes sort of an average of the best time to send the email broadcast and use it.

For example, MailChimp (I swear I am not affiliated with them, I just write about them a ton because they are a great service!) lets you send at the most optimal time for your list once you choose the day.

If your particular brand of email marketing service doesn't permit sending your broadcasts out by analyzing the best time for your list, then I suggest a little split testing. Send each newsletter at various times and see what the results are and go with that, remember to retest periodically.

And finally, if you are looking at this and thinking "pfssssssh I am not gonna do all this work to improve my open rate," I totally get it! Then your best bet is to land in the inboxes first thing in the morning, first thing after lunch or even post-dinner time in the evening.



# German Sweet Chocolate Angel Pie

Now, now you German Chocolate Cake lovers, this is a different critter! No coconut to be found, but tons of yummy goodness none the less. Besides, there are those days when a cake just will not do. A piece of pie is what Grandma ordered!

#### Meringue Shell:

- \* Combine 2 egg whites and 1/8 tsp. Cream of Tartar in mixing bowl.
- Pat well until foamy.
- \* Add 1/2 C. sugar, 2 Tbsp. at a time, beating after each until sugar is blended.
- Continue beating until mixture stands in very stiff peaks.
- Fold in 1/2 C. finely chopped walnuts or pecans (opt.) and 1/2 tsp. vanilla.
- Spoon into lightly greased 8-inch pie pan; make a nest-like shell, building sides up 1/2 inch above edge of pan.
- \*\*Bake in a slow oven (300 degrees) for 50 to 55 minutes.
- Cool to room temperature. (Meringue shell or entire pie may be made the day before).

## Chocolate Angel Filling:

- Place 1 package (1 lb.) Baker's German Sweet Chocolate and 3 Tbsp. water in a saucepan over low heat.
- Tir until chocolate is melted.
- Cool until thickened.
- Add 1 tsp. vanilla.
- Whip 1 C. whipping cream.
- Fold chocolate mixture into whipped cream.
- Pile into baked meringue shell.
- Chill 2 hours before serving.


